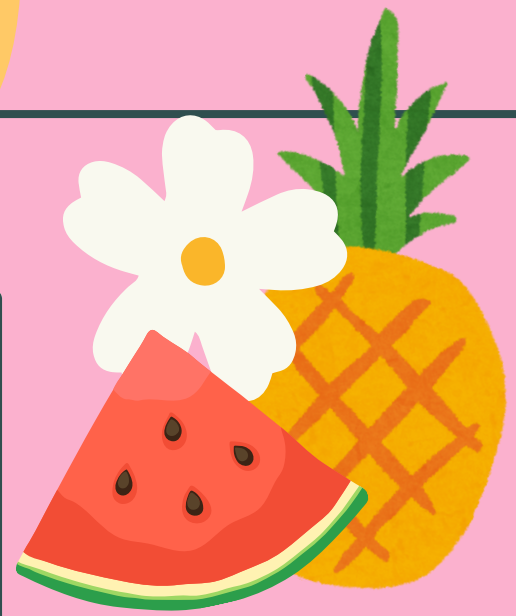
# School Tours

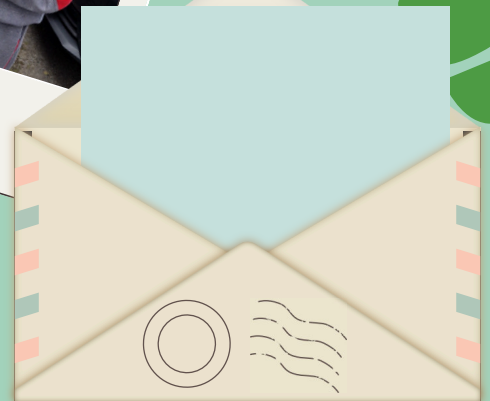

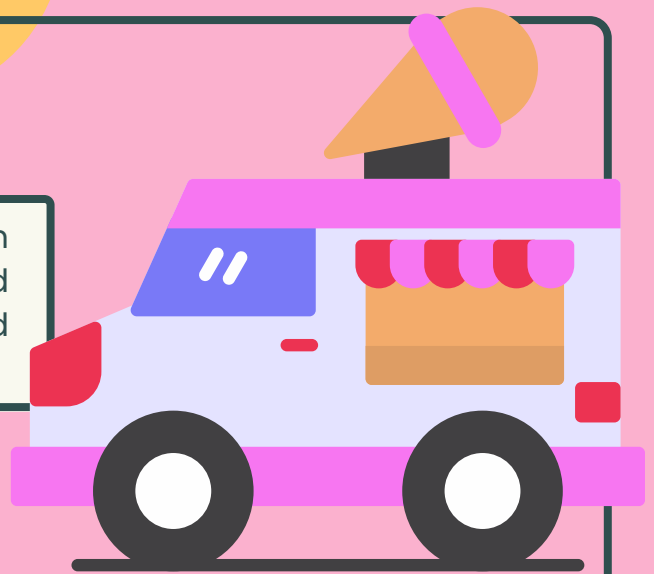
# Letter to My Future Self

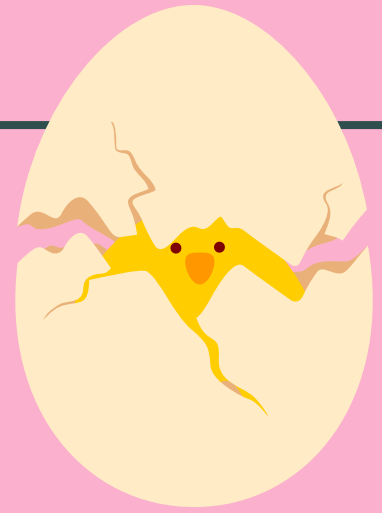
# Onesie Walk

# Eggciting news!

On June 5th, Ms White set up an incubator in Ms.Kennedy's senior infants classroom. We have 14 eggs in total. 10 eggs are from a Light Sussex hen and 4 from a Maran hen. Chicks take approximately 21 days to hatch. The incubator controls the temperature, the humidity and the egg turning. The whole school is counting down the days to hatching day.
